RESEARCH INTERESTS

Deleuzian Studies

My research has widely explored Gilles Deleuze's works, with a particular emphasis on the ones written during the '60s, and above all *The Logic of Sense* (1969). I have conducted further research on Deleuzian ontology of simulacra and his undermining of Platonism, as well as its ethical and aesthetic outcomes. My future research aims to achieve a wider understanding of Deleuze's theory of sense, drawing attention to the relationship among dissimulation, nonsense and perversion in a psychoanalytic sense, engaging a creative encounter with Lewis Carroll's nonsensical logic as it is expressed in his literary works.

Psychoanalysis

My research is closely concerned with themes like desire, projective identification, perversion, *folie à deux*, dissociative personality, narcissism. I have explored psychoanalytic literature on the above mentioned topics, focusing on authors as Jacques Lacan, Melanie Klein, Harold Searles, Otto Kernberg, Gérard Pommier. So far, my research has particularly explored the different implications of the notion of desire, ranging from the clinical to the aesthetical and political ones, following the current debate about the affirmative Deleuzian version of desire and the negative Lacanian version of it. Furthermore, I am interested in the ways the Lacanian "mirror stage" and "dialectics of desire" opens up to the envy of the Other and the struggle for recognition, with outcomes which can vary from a neurotic balancing of the self, to a borderline or psychotic personality organization.

Aesthetics

My research has observed the multifaceted variety of Deleuzian aesthetic and cultural framework. I have highlighted Deleuzian affinities with pop cultures and "cultural fashion", with a specific focus upon the link between aesthetics of simulacra and Japanese prints of the *ukiyo-e* genre. Furthermore, my future research aims to reframe Deleuzian studies on cinema around his notion of surface, connecting my analysis to Slavoj Žižek's works, mainly *Organs without Bodies* and *Less Than Nothing*.

Far East Popular Culture

My whole research is situated against the backdrop of the postmodern condition. Far East popular cultures, especially Japanese, Korean and Chinese ones, are a privileged point of observation of the postmodern dynamics as they have been anticipated in Deleuze and Guattari's *Capitalism and Schizophrenia*. The logic of postmodern visual cultures is akin to that of the desiring-production, and it can be profitably investigated through an aesthetic exploration of visual and literary works coming from the East Asian pop cultures. My research in this field is conducted from within the Mutual Images Research Association, which collect scholars and academics from Europe and Asia, interested in the reciprocal representation between East Asian countries and Europe.
